CDC Cancer Genomics Program: Translating Research into Public Health Practice - Lynette Phillips & Camille Roundy

- New 3 year funding opportunity for review.
- Program is involved with Hereditary Breast and Ovarian Cancer (HBOC) Syndrome and Lynch Syndrome (LS).
- Partnered with the Utah Cancer Registry, Population Database, Intermountain Health Care, and the U of U Huntsman Cancer Institute.
- Ceiling for the annual award is \$550,000. Will be applying for the full ceiling amount.
- Patients will start having a family health history collected and if high risk is shown, there will be a referral for genetic counseling.

- New data fields have been added to the Utah Cancer Registry that will be capturing Hereditary Breast and Ovarian Cancer (HBOC) and whether or not there were referrals to genetic counseling and/or testing.
- Utah is 1 of 5 states that have received Cancer Genomics funding.
- Public health role will be to work with family members of patients identified as having a genetic mutation and get them in for cascade screening as well as health provider education.
- Money is not allowed to be used to pay for screenings.
- Marc Babitz moves to make this exempt so it does not need to be reviewed every year.
