\*Zyban is FDA approved only for smoking cessation. Bupropion is the generic name for both Zyban and Wellbutrin. However, Wellbutrin is FDA approved only for depression. It is not recommended for pregnant women or ages 18 and under.

\*\*\*Chantix – Medicaid covers up to 24 weeks per year of this prescription. It is not recommended for pregnant women or ages 18 and under.

Medicaid clients can fill tobacco cessation prescriptions at any pharmacy.

Dual Eligibles (Medicare and Medicaid eligible) – Medicare does not cover tobacco cessation products. However, Medicaid covers some tobacco cessation products as listed above.

All Medicaid clients are eligible for a variety of free services through the Tobacco Quit Line. For those who are ready to quit, intensive quit counseling and nicotine replacement (patch, gum, lozenge) are available. For more information call **1.800.QUIT.NOW**
