- Keep your appointments or cancel the day before




Remember to always show your card before you get any services.

## Important Information About Medicaid



There are two Medicaid Programs: Traditional and Non-Traditional. Each program has different benefits.

Traditional Medicaid is for children, pregnant women, the aged, blind and disabled.

Non-Traditional is for non-pregnant parents with children on Medicaid.

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## What is a Health or Dental Plan?

A health plan is a group of doctors, clinics, hospitals, pharmacies and other medical experts that you use for your medical care.

A dental plan is a group of dentist who work with a plan to provide dental services.

If you live in Davis, Salt Lake, Utah or Weber Counties, you must choose a health plan. Pregnant women and children who live in these counties must also choose a dental plan. If you do not choose your plan, one will be chosen for you.

If you live in any other county, you can choose to have a health plan or state Medicaid.

## Medicaid Benefits

- Birth Control / Family Planning
- Dental \*
- Doctor Visits
- Hospital Services
- Lab & X-ray
- Medical Supplies
- Mental Health
- Prescriptions
- Transportation Services
- Well Child Exams (CHEC)

\* Only pregnant women and children have dental benefits. Non-pregnant adults only have limited emergency dental benefits.

You may have to pay a co-payment for some services. Pregnant women and children do not have co-payments.

## My Rights

You have the right to:

- be treated fairly.
- be treated with courtesy & respect
- have your privacy protected
- get medical care no matter what your race, color, nationality, disability, sex, religion, or age
- receive information on all available treatment options
- take part in decisions regarding your medical care, including refusing treatment
- ask for a copy of your records and ask that they be changed
